Welcome Students and Parents to Middle School!

SLEs, SCHOOLWIDE LEARNING EXPECTATIONS

A Middle School student of Holy Family Grade School is:

- a faithful and active Catholic.
- academically prepared.
- an effective and confident communicator.
- a globally responsible citizen.

ATTENDANCE

School begins promptly at 8:00 a.m. Students arriving after that time will be marked tardy. We urge you to make every effort to see that your children arrive at school on time. Students arriving after recess will be marked absent half a day. Prompt and regular attendance is important. A student can never make up a day missed, even if the assignments are completed. Therefore, we ask that whenever possible, appointments, vacations, and other activities, which require your child to miss school, are scheduled for times when school is not in session.

DRESS CODE AND PERSONAL APPEARANCE

In addition to the dress code outlined in the Parent Student Handbook we expect the following:

Boys and Girls:

- Cardigan sweaters must be worn during formal occasions such as the School Mass on Tuesdays.
- Socks must be solid white and worn above the ankle and shoe line.
- Shoes must be closed-toe black with rubber soles.
- Athletic shoes must be black.
- The color of shoelaces must match to the shoe.
- Only school uniform sweatshirts are allowed.
- The length of the girls' skirts must be to the knee.
- Navy blue or white tights only may be worn under the skirt.
- All shirts must be tucked in always.
- Students must come to school well groomed.

If these regulations are not adhered to, students will receive an infraction.

CELLULAR PHONE POLICY

Students are permitted to bring cellular phones to school but they must be kept in the students' backpacks and used only in case of an emergency. Any student who abuses this policy will receive an infraction.

HOMEWORK

The purpose of homework is to reinforce learning by encouraging further research, by organizing and applying knowledge, and by practicing necessary basic skills. Parents are encouraged to provide for their children an environment free from distraction and conducive to good study habits. Teachers will generally assign homework daily. It is the student's responsibility to write down the assignments in the homework agenda book provided. All homework assignments should be completed neatly, carefully, and promptly.

Please check and sign the student assignment book to see that your child is doing homework as it is assigned, and that the entire assignment is completed. Each teacher has a policy regarding homework that is not completed.

Upon returning to school after an absence, it is the **student's responsibility** to find out what work must be made up. Teachers will NOT provide classwork or homework for future dates, such as for absences due to family vacations. Homework in Grades 6---8 does not to exceed 2 hours. This does not include assigned reading time or time spent on long---range assignments.

ACADEMIC INTEGRITY

Academic dishonesty, e.g., cheating, plagiarism, copying other students' work, and so forth, is considered a very serious offense. Parents will be notified and a conference may be required. Any and all students involved in the incident will receive an automatic "0" for the assignment and will be unable to make up this grade. The student will be required to complete the assignment (so that he/she learns the material) but will receive no credit for it. Depending on the gravity of the situation, and at the teacher's discretion in consultation with the principal, further action will be taken, including, but not limited to, removal from student council or CYO sports teams.

BEHAVIORAL GUIDELINES AND CONSEQUENCES

It is expected that Holy Family Grade School students conduct themselves within the accepted norms of Christian Values.

INFRACTION POLICY

In order to monitor and immediately correct misbehavior, all middle school teachers will give an infraction slip to students who choose to disobey school rules. If a child receives an infraction slip, it needs to be signed by both the student and the parent and returned the following school day.

This policy includes, but is not limited to, the following infractions:

Minor Infractions:

Disruptive behavior (to be given at the teacher's discretion)

Utilizing the iPad for non-educational purposes during school hours, e.g., social media, games, text messages (8:00 AM-3:00PM)

Unauthorized use of a cellular phone during school hours (8:00AM-3:00 PM)

Being out of uniform (determined by the homeroom teacher during uniform check)

Chewing gum

Wearing nail polish

Dyed hair

Use of cosmetic products, e.g., powder, colored lip gloss, mascara, foundation

*Three minor infractions can result in a one-day suspension.

Major Infractions:

Any form of bullying with the intent to induce physical, mental, and/or emotional harm to another student(s)

The use of foul language (including racial slurs)

Cheating or plagiarizing

Defacing school property

Disrespecting authority

Disrespecting a coach and/or referee(s) during an after school sporting event

Disrespecting Student Council

*A major infraction can result in a one-day suspension.

Certain types of negative behavior may call for immediate suspension/expulsion, per the discretion of the principal.

Student infractions will affect the student's overall report card behavior grade.

Policies are subject to change.

CHEATING

Cheating and dishonesty are contrary to the philosophy of Holy Family Grade School. Cheating can be a cause for suspension, probation, or dismissal from school. These policies apply to all iPad and hand-written assignments. The school interprets cheating as follows, though not limited to the following:

- Copying assignments or allowing another student to copy assignments in or out of class
- Giving or receiving answers to quizzes, tests and examinations
- Looking at another's paper or allowing another to look at one's paper
- Plagiarism
- Doing another person's work or allowing another to do one's work
- E-mailing completed assignments to each other

When a student is involved in a cheating incident, the teacher takes the following actions:

- Assigns a failing grade to the test, quiz, or assignment
- Informs parents
- Issues an infraction slip
- Hands the matter over to the principal

REPORTING STUDENT PROGRESS AND GRADING SCALE

At the end of each quarter a report card is issued to every student. Report cards should be reviewed, signed by a parent, and returned to the homeroom teacher.

If a student is absent for fifteen or more days within the same grading period, report card grades may be withheld until the work is made up. Grades are regularly accessed through **Gradelink**.

BEHAVIORAL GUIDELINES AND ACCOUNTABILITY

At the end of each quarter, Behavior and Work Habits infractions are reviewed and the quarter grades determined. These grades are noted as a part of the student's permanent academic record. Because of the seriousness of some offenses, e.g., disrespect to teachers, staff, or parent volunteers, fighting, extremely offensive language, bullying, and so forth, students may receive an Infraction Slip or a suspension and/or be referred to the Vice Principal and Principal for further disciplinary action.

A – F will be used for grading Middle School students in CONDUCT and EFFORT. In reporting on conduct, the teacher can indicate whether the student meets expectations in cooperating with others, respecting others and observing rules and procedures. In reporting on work habits, the teacher can indicate whether the student uses time wisely, listens carefully, completes assignments, writes legibly, works independently or seeks help when needed, and completes work.

The following grades and descriptors will be used:

- A – Excellent; meets all expectations (93-100%)
- B - Above Average; meets some expectations (85 – 92%)
- C – Satisfactory; inconsistently meets expectations (74 – 84%)
- D – Below Average; does not meet expectations (65-73%)
- F – Unsatisfactory; does not meet expectations despite reminders and communication with parents (Below 65%)

MIDDLE SCHOOL IPAD ACCEPTABLE USE POLICY

To ensure the learning and safety of all our students, Holy Family Grade School students and parents agree to both read and follow these guidelines:

1. iPads are for educational use. Students who play games, text, or access any social networks during class time will immediately receive an infraction slip.
2. iPads must be turned OFF at the beginning of the school day and will be turned on only when asked by the teacher. This will help with Internet issues.
3. All iPad wallpaper and backgrounds must be school---appropriate. Any violent or graphic content is unacceptable.
4. Watching videos online is disruptive to learning and burdens our wireless networks. Online videos slow Internet access. Unless indicated otherwise by the teacher, streaming videos is prohibited.
5. Students are allowed to install games on the iPads. However, these games should not be on the first few home screens nor should be played during school hours.
6. To ensure the safety of your iPad, students are not allowed to take their iPads out to morning or lunch recess.
7. Students **are** responsible for updating their apps and the iPad IOS on a regular basis. Backups should be made on their laptop or desktop computer once a week. Depending on the IOS version on the iPad, students will be able to store their data on the "cloud." Students must maintain this space wisely to ensure that all appropriate school documents are stored.
8. Students are responsible for writing down their iPad's lock---screen password. Teachers cannot reset this password. Students should not share this password with other classmates.
9. Students are allowed music on their iPads. However, music can only be listened to with a teacher's permission. No streaming music is allowed at school. Files must be in iTunes.
10. When walking to or from school, be safe and smart! Don't show or use your iPad. You don't want to be at risk for being robbed or mugged.

2. The paper must be typed in black using Times New Roman font size 12.
3. Double Space
4. One-inch margins at the top, bottom, right, and left sides of the paper.
5. Number the pages consecutively in the upper right hand corner of each page next to your name.
6. Include your first and last name, teacher's name, subject, and date in the upper left hand corner of the first page.
7. Center the title of your assignment
8. Indent (one tab) your paragraphs.
