Highlighting Some Social Studies standards in the classrooms

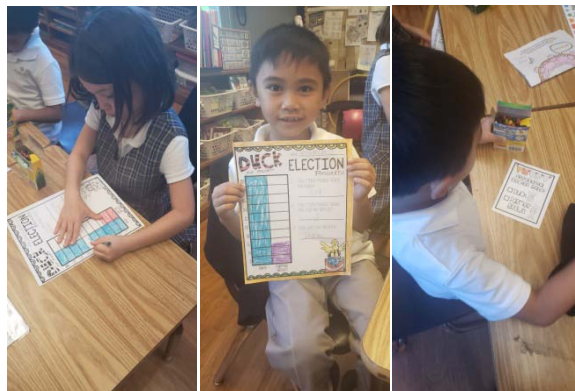
Kindergarten – Mrs. Teresa Nelson

Kindergarten is becoming geographically aware by exploring maps and map legends. The students compared map legends of the world to identify oceans and mountains. Using the map of the United States, students identified the State of California, Pacific Ocean, and the State capital.



1st Grade – Miss Justine Bote

Students are learning about how choices are made in the government. Students are actively engaging and learning about voting by casting their vote on a ballot that goes along with the story “Duck for President” by Doreen Cronin. Students graph the votes and take note of the winner. This activity helps the students to see how choices are made in the government.



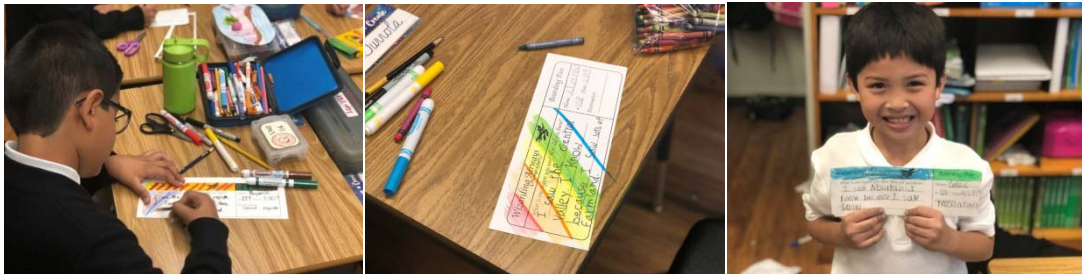
2nd Grade – Miss Elisha Ty



Students are able to find their place in the world and the groups/communities that they belong to. In this Social Studies project, the children identify and specify locations and geographic features in their neighborhood or community. They are also able to label from memory a simple map of the North American continent and where the state of California is.

3rd Grade – Mrs. Pamela Wardle

Students are learning about the different regions of California. They took a “trip” around California and talked about the different landforms and regions they saw.
