Sunday, 1/26: Celebrating your Parish

CSW Day #1

A reading: Jesus brings the light and truth of salvation to the world.

The prophet Isaiah foretold that the good news of salvation would reach Jews and Gentiles in the "land

beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the nations" (Isaiah 9:1). Jesus begins the proclamation of the Gospel here to fulfill the word of God. The Old Testament prophets spoke of God's promise to send a Redeemer who would establish God's rule. That time is now fulfilled in Jesus who brings the light and truth of the Gospel to the world.

Monday, 1/27: Celebrating your Community. Classes will meet up with class buddies and collaborate on a project that focuses on topics such as recycling and being stewards of the world. While doing so, the students will dress up as their favorite characters (characters from novels, movies, cartoons, etc.).
