# Some updates from DCS Superintendent Paul Escala on his memo dated 5/17/2021

We have a few updates to provide to you regarding Public Health:

• Masking: Today, the State of California announced that masking requirements will remain in place through June 15, 2021, including for all vaccinated individuals. Come

June 15<sup>th</sup>, in accordance with the governor's plan, the state's recovery blueprint will be suspended and the tier system regulations on all social and business sectors will be lifted. Until then, please maintain alignment with all masking requirements on-campus.

- End of the Year Activities: All five of the public health departments in the ADLA are following the CDPH guidance for end of the year school events. LACDPH is NOT planning to make their guidance stricter than the state.
- Vaccine Eligibility Expansion: Individuals 12 years old and up are now eligible to receive the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine. We are strongly encouraging all parents and guardians to vaccinate their eligible children. The DCS is working with public health to identify ways we can partner to educate and vaccinate students who want to be vaccinated. While there is no mandate for TK-12 students to receive the vaccine to enter school, we believe it's vital that parents and guardians are informed of the safety and necessity of being vaccinated for COVID-19 to protect their children, families and friends.
- Next School Year: Based on our discussions with the state and local public health authorities we are advising all schools to prepare for full-time in-person instruction for all students. We anticipate all distancing requirements for in-person instruction will be lifted, among other restrictions. However, at this time it's unclear if masking requirements for unvaccinated students and staff will remain in effect. Please prepare for the likelihood of this rule. Further, it's likely that should an outbreak occur, schools will be required to adhere to certain transmission mitigation rules. We will share any and all new rules for the next school year once we receive them.
- 2021-22 School Year Contingency Planning: While we all pray that next school year is uninterrupted, prudence dictates that a contingency plan is put in place in the event a surge occurs. Therefore, we are advising all schools to have their distance learning plans ready to implement, particularly as the Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays approach. One mitigation tool we are working with public health on is school-wide testing. Should we experience another surge, COVID-19 testing of staff and students may be the key to remaining open. We will be working with public health officials on leveraging federal and state funds to pay for testing for schools that opt-in. We are also acquiring an additional round of PPE for the new school year from the state. More information will follow.

We continue to live in an ever changing public health environment; however, it's now clear that the improvements we've made are holding. Let's continue to encourage safety and vaccinations to ensure that the past year is exactly that – the past. Thank you.



# 5th Grade Performs an Emancipation Proclamation Drama in Social Studies by Mr. Clarence Clark

Using a green screen with a "Presidential" virtual background, 13 5th Graders performed a short play on the complexities behind Abraham Lincolns's Emancipation Proclamation. While Miss Medina shot a few stills, Mr. Clark recorded the session using Zoom. Among the historical personages included were William Seward, Salmon Chase, Charles Sumner and Lincoln himself. Students were given a situation, and were tasked with identifying if the sample was biased or random.
