5th Week of School: Important for the Weeks of September 20th and 27th, 2021

Dear HFGS Families, Faculty, Staff, Students, and Friends,

Let's celebrate Fr. Marlon's good news! The Office of the Vicar for Clergy in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles has announced that after a prayerful process of consultation and discernment, it is with great joy that the office announces that the following priests have been incardinated into the Archdiocese of Los Angeles:



Reverend Marlon Mateo (Formerly of the Carmelite Fathers)

Currently serving as Associate Pastor of Holy Family Catholic Church in Glendale.

Reverend Ambrose Udoji (Formerly of the Diocese of Nnewi, Nigeria)

Currently serving as Associate Pastor of St. Linus Catholic Church in Norwalk.

Reverend Roberto Rueda (Formerly of the Legionaries of Christ)

Currently serving as Associate Pastor of St. Joseph Catholic Church in La Puente.

Please note that the 4th weekly COVID-19 testing continues and tomorrow, Monday, will be the distribution of kits, nasal swab testing from home, and returning the specimen tubes on Tuesday, 9/21/21. Please make sure that you RETEST on the website, NOT register. We all have registered so it means that when we each click RETEST, we will only have to enter our email address and the specific WEEKLY TESTING BARCODE (which changes every week). Then, check your email to receive a CONFIRMATION BARCODE to use. This becomes the proof that you have submitted and awaits for your weekly test result. During the week of 9/14/21 collected specimens, all had NEGATIVE results with two (2) rejected. There were a few without any results yet the claim was that they submitted the tubes with their child's swabs. To repeat, if no email confirmation was received from your end, that means they have not received your RETEST info (email address and weekly barcode). You should log in and encode every after swab test. Proper swabbing and encoding of barcode are required for rejects.

We highly recommend each family's taking advantage of this weekly testing for your peace of mind and everybody's safety.

TK & Kindergarten – by Mrs. Teresa Nelson

Transitional Kindergartners can identify the letters in their name. Students find each letter of their name and with help, place them on the white magnetic board.



Kindergarten can sort items by like attributes. Students choose how they will sort the objects (size, shape, or color). Students describe how they sorted the items to their table partner.



1st Graders Learn How to Predict and Describe – by Ms. Justine Bote

Our 1st graders first drew their own creations on paper towels using washable markers! Using some water on a small paintbrush, our 1st graders predicted what would happen when they "painted" over their drawings. Many of our 1st graders predicted that the colors would get darker or would blend together. Our 1st graders then described what they saw as they were painting!



2nd Graders Learn About Cultural Intelligence – by Miss Alexa Isaac

Our 2nd graders began a social studies unit on Cultural Intelligence; the ability to relate and work with people across different cultures. An interactive PowerPoint lesson was presented to the class and each student was given the opportunity to share what they love about their own culture. Then, each student was given a pack of "Colors of the World" crayons so they could find the shade that best represents

them for all their self portraits. They used these for their "Unpacking My Culture" scrapbook and are able to express themselves with a prompt on each page.
