Student, Faculty, & Staff Wednesday Assembly to Review and Practice How To Prepare for Any School Intruder, Active Shooter, and Emergency Lockdown Drills

We are holding a lockdown drill in case there is a real emergency in our school. We would like to make certain that each class / person is prepared; and that if done properly, in conjunction with the training we have had even before pandemic, the drills will provide all of us an opportunity to train our staff and students, to review what we had in the recent years pre-pandemic, to build their personal confidence in their ability to respond in an actual crisis, and to continue to provide everyone a safe school environment. The National Association of School Psychologists notes on its website, "Lockdowns can save lives and are considered best practice in crisis response."

We are going to use the protocol directives of "**Locks, Lights, and Out of Sight.**" *That involves locking classroom doors, turning off lights, staying out of sight and remaining quiet. The lockdowns that we would like to keep consistent in the same drill is for our teachers to offer frequent and calm reassurance especially to the youngest groups we take care of and teach.*

We are particularly blessed that **The City of Glendale, its Police Association and The Glendale Fire Department,** works hand in hand with us. Their quick response and regular monitoring of school campuses is worthy of our praise. These drills will definitely give each a sense of confidence, safety and security.
