We are blessed to have a bright and open MakerSpace classroom that facilitates student learning. 7th grade and 8th grade students have begun utilizing this space during science sessions, and they have enjoyed the unique setup of this classroom, which promotes collaboration.

Once the robotics program begins in the second quarter, students from 4th to 8th grades will have the opportunity to assemble robots and program them to function. Since one of the purposes of the MakerSpace room was to promote student collaboration, the robotics program is particularly suited to take advantage of this setting's dynamic. Students will develop their problem-solving, critical thinking, and communications skills as they build unique robots.

In April 2023, HFGS will celebrate Earth Day and thus reinforce the need to be proper stewards of our planet's resources. As such, 7th and 8th grade students will be asked to bring recyclable products that they can use to design robots and create various forms of artwork.
