We are excited to announce the beginning of our social studies contest. On Monday, November 14th, teachers across all grade levels will present the topics and guidelines for this contest. Each grade level will produce unique projects and/or presentations that highlight a specific element of the social studies curriculum. Students' critical thought, creativity, and communication skills will be showcased with each work. Upon their completion, teachers will utilize a rubric or a set of standards to objectively assess the quality of each project/presentation and thereafter select awardees from first to third place, along with honorable mentions. The number of awards will be decided by each teacher. We look forward to seeing our students' amazing work!

1st Grade Activities by Miss Mary Ann Gutierrez

In 1st Grade, we are currently learning about multiple topics such as creating simple design tests in Science and what is voting in Social Studies. For Science, we had the question of "What kind of paper airplane can we make that can go from one end of the auditorium to the other?" In pairs, we tried to fold and color two parts (wings and nose) in different ways. After testing our first batch of planes, we discussed how we could improve our designs and folded another plane, explaining to everyone what we changed.

In Social Studies, we held a ballot session to vote for what should we add to our Friday Fun Time. Our choices were for extra art materials or board games. Each student wrote their vote onto an index card and put it into a box. Later on, we counted them together and ended up with a tie! In the future, we will probably use this method again since it was so successful.

Our 3rd Graders' Integration of Holidays from Miss Alma Stone, 3rd Grade Faculty

While the holidays are quickly approaching, 3rd graders are taking full advantage and using them as part of our learning. Since the previous week, we started reading How to Catch a Turkey by Adam Wallace and Andy Elkerton. We are utilizing this book to help us learn across the curriculum. Then, we are rewriting the story in the 3rd person point of view. We are using it for science and the children are making traps to try to catch a turkey stuffed animal as well. We are all excited about this and love when ELA and Science come up in our day.

Concert Chorus Maestro Tomas Makiling's Report

In our Fall music sessions, we have been learning Rhythmic Body Percussion which teaches TK- Second Grade students how to use their bodies as percussion instruments by snapping, clapping, patting, stomping, tapping, and other gestures while using fall musical themes. The music spelling bee, note name speed test, the musical word finder race, and unscramble music terms have all been assigned to the Third-Fifth Grade classes. The music spelling

bee requires students to identify the notes on the staff in order to reveal a word. In middle school, the Eighth Grade class, in particular, began composing a brief phrase in the key of G Major. Students in the Seventh and Sixth Grade classes have been reading about Johann Sebastian Bach, a composer, and organist during the Baroque era. Students complete a word search from the reading. In another lesson, they do complete a note name speed test and record their fastest time.

As you may have noticed, the children have been singing again. We resumed singing together in school and at church after a break of nearly two years. We are excited to announce that we are currently getting ready for our much-anticipated Christmas concert, titled "Heaven and Nature Sing" - our first live school concert after the pandemic. Each class will provide a performance of their favorite Christmas tunes. The concert is scheduled for Thursday, December 15, 2022, at 7 PM.

Our Spanish Classroom News - by Miss Vania Chileno

The teacher has had the opportunity to carry out a thorough evaluation of the language level of the students and the concerns that they have had. Students have shared their opinion about the importance of learning Spanish. Creating a Spanish portfolio has begun in upper levels (4th to 8th) where each class chooses two Spanish-speaking countries to learn more about their history, culture, and music.

For the lower levels. TK through 3rd grade levels have explored the world of animals. The teaching method used is based mainly on the **EXPLORATION** of the language through the **CULTURE**, and developed in **GAMES**. This method helps to make the learning process more dynamic, promotes teamwork, and requires 100% use of the brain and body.
