### Summer School 2023

Our families received either the **Required or Recommended Summer School** letter through the Wednesday family envelopes. Immediately, our office has received thoughtfully and respectfully written emails of acceptances and further clarifications. The required Summer School letter follows the criteria of the essential/significant need to:

- \* further enhance or equip the child's missed skills in reading and key concepts / computational skills in math;
- \* improve Standardized Test scores and daily school work;
- \* compensate for the lost instructional time due to student's excessive tardies and absences during the school year;
- \* bridge the academic gap;
- \* prepare the student for the next grade level;
- \* spend four through six weeks of parents' choice of child's scholarly and fun time in learning here at HFGS. ## TK Goes to Outer Space - Mrs. Beatriz Herrera

TK will be learning all about Outer Space in the next few weeks. We will begin by learning about the moon and sun. Then continue onto the different planets in the solar system and finally, focusing on the stars. This unit ignites the imaginations of the TK students because they can look up and see the moon, sun and twinkling stars, but they are actually millions of miles away. Each lesson will begin with a video, the children will use their creativity to make a model of the solar system. Adding a planet to the model each time we learn about a new one. students will become familiar with key vocabulary, such as orbit, gravity, asteroid, etc. Finally, we will culminate the unit by learning about humans in space, the development of space shuttles, training to be astronauts, followed by the moon landing.

# "The Little Red Hen" Language Arts, Math, and Science Integrated Lesson by Mrs. Teresa Nelson

The Kindergarten class read the story "The Little Red Hen" and used this story to integrate Math, Science and Language Arts. Our students retold the story by acting out all the character parts using masks, and a narrator. Using differentiated instruction, students were given three different worksheets to retell the story by cut and paste and writing at their academic level.

Our students baked bread using measuring skills and cut the bread into halves and fourths as we have been learning whole, half, and fourths in Math class.

In our science unit on the properties of matter, our students learned that matter can change. The Kindergartners made their own butter in jars by shaking cream and salt to show that a liquid can turn into a solid.

## 1st Grade Report by Miss Mary Ann Gutierrez

Currently, we are working on sacraments, highlighting what is Baptism and what are the parts involved. Also, in Math, we are measuring objects with standard and non-standard units (ie. coins). For Science, we are still learning about plants, especially the three types (flowers, shrubs, trees) so we walked around our school yard searching to get pictures of these types. We measured leaves with paper clips, the way we do it in Math. Looking forward to an enjoyable field trip at the Kids Space Museum with our awesome 1st grade class.

## Farming in 2nd Grade by Miss Alexa Isaac

We received our Lettuce Grow Farmstand thanks to a STEM grant from Azuza Pacific University written by Dr. Kiladjian. The students will be able to take care of various plants such as butter lettuce, mini cucumber, sugar sprint pea, astro arugula, green beans, and bok choy. Students get hands-on experience with the plant life cycle, forming a positive association with a healthy diet and lifestyle, and eliminate unnecessary waste. I look forward to sharing our progress with this project!

### Robotics and Chess by Dr. Krikor Kiladjian

The robotics club is composed of students in grades fourth through eighth and it meets on Mondays and Fridays at 3:15 p.m. in the new MakerSpace room. Students assemble and code different age appropriate units such as LEGO Mindstorm, LEGO Boost, and JIMU astrobot. The students eagerly attend each session and enjoy their time as they collaboratively develop their robots. Students' creative and critical thinking along with problem-solving skills are enhanced as a result of their work. Students were able to discuss and present their work during the morning assembly on Wednesday, April 19th, which captured the interest of the student body.

The chess club is composed of students in grades third through eighth and it meets on Wednesdays and Thursdays at 3:15 p.m. Students learn the fundamentals of chess and subsequently progress to learning opening moves and offensive/defensive strategies to enhance their play. Students are excited to attend the sessions and practice their skills with each other.
