6th Grade News from Mr. John Roxas

As the year comes to a close, the 6th grade is preparing for the next stage in their math journey. For the past few weeks, the 6th graders have been learning about Variables and Exponents. This includes knowing how to isolate a variable within an equation and knowing how to solve an expression when the variable is given a value. With this lesson, students will then be able to use variables as placeholders for values that may be unknown. This skill will be the fundamental skill that the 6th graders will need in order to succeed in the 7th grade.

7th Grade: Cell Sample Investigation by Dr. Krikor Kiladjian

The 7th grade students will soon utilize the school's new monocular compound microscopes in the MakerSpace room to examine various samples of human tissue, animal cells, plant cells, bacteria, and fungi. A collaborative research assignment will be assigned to assess student learning. These new resources, which were purchased through the "Bringing STEM to Life" grant, will provide students the opportunity to visualize the content learned in the classroom while simultaneously inculcating an even greater interest in life science.

8th Graders' Culminating Activities by Mrs. Ashley Liberda

The 8th grade class has been finalizing all grades to ensure they are cleared academically. By being cleared, the students are able to fully celebrate their accomplishments and success stories.
