Summer School 2023

Our families received either the **Required or Recommended Summer School** letter through the Wednesday family envelopes. Immediately, our office has received thoughtfully and respectfully written emails of acceptances and further clarifications. The required Summer School letter follows the criteria of the essential/significant need to: * further enhance or equip the child's missed skills in reading and key concepts / computational skills in math;

* improve Standardized Test scores and daily school work;

* compensate for the lost instructional time due to student's excessive tardies and absences during the school year;

- * bridge the academic gap;
- * prepare the student for the next grade level;

* spend four through six weeks of the parents' choice of a child's scholarly and fun time in learning here at HFGS. 5th Grade Spanish - by Miss Vania Chileno Olivera

In the 5th Grade Spanish class, we were learning about "las comidas" which included activities to learn *new vocabulary* (name of some foods, foods of the day: breakfast, lunch, dinner; fruits and vegetables, utensils, etc.), the correct use of the *articles*: definite (la, las, el, los) and indefinite (un, una, unos, unas), *present verb conjugation*: preparar, mezclar, agregar, amasar, etc., and *culture*: preparation of "arepas Colombianas." The students enjoyed putting in practice what they learned, giving the instructions in Spanish, using the vocabulary in the process, and learning something new about a Spanish speaking country.

8th Grade by Mrs. Ashley Liberda

As the 8th grade students prepare for their futures, they have selected a career of choice, researched that specific career, and then constructed a five-paragraph essay highlighting the various aspects of that career. Students have familiarized themselves with the educational or job requirements, the work setting, the population served, and the salary of their chosen career. By having a better understanding of their dream jobs, they will be able to strategically select their elective classes to strengthen their skills to best perform their future careers.

4th Grade Skits, Commercials, and Musical Acts/5th Grade Play by Ms. Katy Huntley

In the 4th quarter, the 4th and 5th grade Reading Class is switched. The 5th grade teacher is responsible for the 4th grade students' Reading Curriculum, Assessments, and Final Grade. As part of the English Language Arts curriculum, the 4th Grade teacher guides the 4th grade students in creating, auditioning, and performing skits, commercials, and musical acts to kick off the 5th grade play. The development and execution of the skits ultimately serves to instill self-confidence in students as they briefly take the stage. For the 5th grade students, the teacher selects a play/musical to match the students' dynamics. The 4th grade students and 5th grade students collaborate on adapting a full-length play to be performed at the end of the school year. All students audition and rehearse for speaking/singing roles, and all students have a "behind the scenes" role such as assistant director, backstage manager, et cetera. The 4th grade teacher is responsible for the 5th grade students' Drama Curriculum, Assessments, and Final Grade.


